Ingredients

- 1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin
- 1 (14 ounce) can EAGLE BRAND(R) Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 (9 inch) unbaked pie crust

Directions

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Whisk pumpkin, sweetened condensed milk, eggs, spices and salt in medium bowl until smooth. Pour into crust. Bake 15 minutes.

Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees F and continue baking 35 to 40 minutes or until knife inserted 1 inch from crust comes out clean. Cool

The story of the first Thanksgiving began when a group of English settlers colonized at Plymouth Rock. There, they befriended a group Native Americans who taught them how to grow corn and catch fish. A formal agreement was made between the Pilgrims and the native people to protect and help each other in times of need. In November 1621, after their first successful, fall harvest the Pilgrims invited their Native American allies to a celebratory feast that we now refer to as Thanksgiving.


