#### A Year in Review



# What a year it's been! Goodwill SWFL Pandemic Response

We began 2020 watching the unfolding of a global pandemic - one that forced people out of jobs and homes, and out of the security of feeling safe. The challenges left in its quake have affected everyone.

Though Goodwill SWFL had to close all retail operations in March when the "Safer

at Home" order was issued (the stores that fund our Mission services), our Community Resource Center coordinators continued serving the community by phone - as thousands of Southwest Florida neighbors needed help providing for their families.

Goodwill CRC coordinators helped with unemployment, SNAP & LIHEAP applications. They helped get stimulus payments for non-filers. They helped with CARES applications for those struggling to pay their rent and utilities. And, they helped the homeless with Rapid Rehousing referrals. From Naples to Port Charlotte, Clewiston to Englewood - if there was need for Covid-related assistance in SWFL, Goodwill was helping - if not directly, they were referring them to other partner agencies who could get them the assistance they needed.

When the state reopened in May, our coordinators continued assisting the community through social distancing and using CDC recommendations for safety, including our Mobile unit who has been setting up in underserved communities - where there is limited access to computers & internet, and where travel is a barrier in itself. Our bilingual coordinators assist those with language barriers, and those who lack digital skills. They have been, and still are, serving 300 - 500 people a week throughout Southwest Florida.

# Goodwill served nearly 25,000 people in Southwest Florida in 2020



6,374 people received assistance at one of our Community Resource Centers, or at our Mobile unit that set up in underserved communities throughout SWFL.



Almost 3,000 people came to Goodwill CRCs for Covid-related assistance including help with unemployment, SNAP, LIHEAP and CARES applications. We are helping in Lee County with Rapid Rehousing. And, we are continuing to help the local community daily throughout this pandemic.

## New Virtual Service Delivery For Pathways to Opportunity



Daily online classes kept our PTO participants connected to their peers and their instructors, and allowed them to continue working on their goals.



PTO-2-GO proved successful in many ways. In addition to keeping these vulnerable individuals connected during a frightening time, some individuals actually excelled in the virtual format (having less anxiety to overcome than in-person interactions). PTO-2-GO is such a success, Florida is looking to add the program format to the Medicaid Handbook for providers.

While other disability service programs shut their doors during the pandemic, our Pathways to Opportunity staff found a way to pivot and continue serving our participants. Thanks to a grant by PNC Foundation, 50 Chromebooks were purchased and PTO-2-GO was formed.

#### **Pathways to Opportunity Holiday Fun**

December 2020 was full of celebration for the participants at Pathways to Opportunity.



The participants celebrated the end of the year with a holiday party, spirit days, Five's Cafe baking cookies, making Christmas cards for Veterans, and lots of laughs. Although 2020 brought a lot of uncertainty for our participants, they are very hopeful of what 2021 will bring. Sharing these small moments together got them one step closer to Independence, pride in their work, communications and inspiration to give back.



Goodwill SWFL has a new Mobile Community Resource Center, thanks to Collier CARES. This vehicle, complete with six computer workstations, Internet access and more, will serve those who live in disadvantaged communities throughout Collier County who are typically underserved. It is financed by the U.S. Department of Treasury, Florida Division of Emergency management and Collier County Community and Human Services Division.

"The new mobile center will bring services to people in need, in their own community, who otherwise would not have the opportunity to access essential and critical needs due to transportation and COVID-related barriers. These essential services include linkage to critical services, job search assistance, digital skills training, assistance with unemployment services and much more," explained Carolyn Johnson of Goodwill SWFL.

The MicroEnterprise Institute will offer ten courses in 2021 as well as three alumni workshops. Training will be available to learn and enhance digital skills to increase digital skill literacy required for lives (health records, banking, etc.) and careers.

The Pine Manor Improvement Association will update its kitchen so it can be used commercially, providing a low-cost location for women who are disadvantaged to prepare food for sale, and upgrade AV equipment so how-to and promotional videos can be created.
